

# RAC CANADA DAY CONTEST – 2016 RESULTS

**Web Update:** There was an error in the categorization of a log file. VE3DC was actually MOMT and not MOSTHP. With that change, Hans Brakob, K0HB with a two person team takes 3<sup>rd</sup> place this year with a score of 106,596 in the MOSTHP category.

With Canada Day falling on a Friday this year, it was hoped to see a bit of an uptick from the prior couple of years when the context fell within the work week. There was some increase, about 13% greater than last year. Once again propagation was a challenge and that was reflected in the comments, especially from those outside of North America.

Despite some of those challenges, we did see a new record in the Single Op All Band Phone category. Igor Slakva, VE3ZF added a new record to the category with a score of 457,750

With that bit of introduction, on with the detailed results!

## **SINGLE OP ALL BANDS HIGH POWER**

Tom Haavisto, VE3CX wins the SO-AB-HP plaque sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 645,088. Robert Nash, VE3KZ takes second place with a score of 264,264 and third place as well as the Larry Kayser, VA3LK Memorial Plaque sponsored by Alan Goodacre VE3HX for the Top Scoring Single Operator's Foreign Entry - any authorized power goes to Alan Eshleman, K6SRZ with a score of 210,510.

## **SINGLE OP ALL BANDS LOW POWER**

Ed Richardson, VE4VT using the VE4RAC call sign piloted his station to a 1<sup>st</sup> place finish in the SO-AB-LP category and takes the plaque sponsored by Contest Club

Ontario with a score of 547,646. Tony Osman, VE3RZ takes second place this year with a score of 191,284. Third place goes to Doug Ferris, VA3DF generating a score of 178,524.

## **SINGLE OP – QRP**

Dick Van Zandt, K9OM takes the first place plaque in the SO-AB-QRP category sponsored by QRP Canada with a score of 98,112. Second place goes to Thomas J. Warren, K3TW with a score of 49,506. Third place goes to Robert MacKenzie, VA3RKM with a score of 38,990 points.

## **SINGLE OP ALL BAND PHONE**

As noted in the introduction Igor Slakva, VE3ZF set a new record in this category and takes first place this year capturing the SO-AB-PH plaque sponsored by the Saskatchewan Contest Club with a score of 456,750. Don Fisher, VE3ESE takes second place with a score of 73,080 and Tim Gregory, VA3TIC takes 3<sup>rd</sup> place with a score of 44,050.

## **SINGLE OP ALL BAND CW**

Stefan Bejusca, VA3AR takes first place again this year with a score of 141,102 capturing the SOABCW plaque sponsored by the Maritime Contest Club. Second place goes to Jay Corriveau with a score of 74,298. Bud Mortenson, VA7ST rounds up third place with a score of 50,050.

## **SINGLE OP SINGLE BAND**

Given conditions, 20 meters continues to be the main band for those in the SOSB category and again produced the top three scores in this category. Todd Bendsten, VE5MX call takes first place, winning the SOSB plaque sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 128,750. Michael Smith, VE9AA takes 2<sup>nd</sup>s place with a score of 83,996 and our top 3

rounds out with Mark Morin, VA2MM with a score of 39,312.

The complete listing show the band by band breakdown and power levels for those who like to keep track of that element of SOSB even though it is not an official part of the contest format.

## **MULTI-OPERATOR SINGLE-TRANSMITTER HIGH POWER**

Gordon Kosmenko, VE6SV using the VE6RAC call takes first place in the MO-ST-HP category. His team captures the Alfa Radio sponsored plaque with a score of 738,480. The KCARC team, VE1LD takes second place with a score of 238,728. Hans Brakob, K0HB with a two person team takes 3<sup>rd</sup> place this year with a score of 106,596.

## **MULTI-OPERATOR SINGLE-TRANSMITTER LOW POWER**

Duane Sandmeyer, VE7UF and his team takes 1<sup>st</sup> place this year with a score of 379,456 capturing the MO-ST-LP Tony Allsop - VE3FTA Memorial plaque. Allan Niittymaa, VA3KAI takes 2<sup>nd</sup> place this year with a score of 103,400 and the Nanaimo Amateur Radio Association, VE7NA team takes 3<sup>rd</sup> place with a score of 46,872.

## **MULTI-OPERATOR MULTI-TRANSMITTER**

Contest Group du Quebec, VE2XAA and team using the VA2RAC call takes first place this year in the MO-MT category, taking the plaque sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 508,032. The Mississauga Amateur Radio Club, VE3MIS using the call VA3RAC take second place with a score of 400,680. Our third place finish goes to Marcel LeBlanc, VE9ML and his group using the VE9RAC call with a score of 369,480.

## Top Scoring Single operator - Foreign entry

As noted in the SOABHP results, Alan Eshleman, K6SRZ with a score of 210,510 takes the Larry Kayser, VA3LK Memorial plaque sponsored by Alan Goodacre VE3HX.
